FROM ARCHITECTURE TO RHYTHM, ST. LOUIS IS READY TO MOVE YOU

ST. LOUIS HAS GOALS

The city of St. Louis has always had a soft spot for soccer, but it is about to become a national hotspot when the 2023 Major League Soccer (MLS) season kicks off this spring with its newest team, St. Louis CITY SC. From the big screen to real life, soccer aficionados can now enjoy the thrill of the game up close at the 22,500-seat CITYPARK Stadium. Located on the western edge of downtown, 250 feet from the newly renovated Union Station entertainment mecca. the state-of-the-art openair soccer-specific stadium features a sod field, a metal overhang canopy, green spaces, gathering places, walkways and bikeways,

with every seat within 120 feet of the pitch (the closest just 15 feet from the touchline).

The stadium pitch, which sits 40 feet below street level, will play host to 17 home MLS games, plus three exhibitions each year. The St. Louis CITY SC's Downtown West campus also includes an elite training center, practice fields, a team store, a fan pavilion and the club headquarters.

HOW DOES YOUR GARDEN GROW?

Something is blooming at the Missouri Botanical Garden, and it's not just the plants. The destination's restorative experience just became more vibrant with the completion of the \$100 million LEED-certified Gateway to the Garden expansion, featuring a brand-new 90,000-square-foot visitor center, which includes the Emerson Conservatory with a permanent display of Mediterranean plants. Also new: Sassafras Café—complete with panoramic views, an enlarged garden gift shop and the new Bayer Event Center that will be utilized for educational forums and conferences.

Terrazzo flooring with inlaid brass leaves of native trees, an immersive video wall, multi-tiered entry gardens, wider pathways and a wall of windows with stunning views of the surrounding landscape only add to the experience. While you're in St. Louis, join us for a good thyme in the garden.

MEMORIALIZE & HONOR SURVIVORS

Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum opened late last year, bringing a world-class educational facility and museum to Lindbergh Boulevard. This brand-new complex is triple the size of the original museum, and the \$21 million expansion created additional space for the display of cultural and historic artifacts, survivor galleries, workshops and discussions, and multipurpose space for media and film.

Dedicated to keeping the memory of the Holocaust alive and using the lessons learned to fight hatred and injustice, the museum goes beyond teaching history and works to promote understanding and inspire change.



Rawlings is stepping up to the plate and moving to Westport Plaza, a vibrant mixed-use development in Maryland Heights.

Since 1887, Rawlings has been synonymous with America's pastime, making gloves, balls and other baseball gear, in addition to being the creator of the iconic Gold Glove Award. In late 2023, the Rawlings experiential retail space will open to the cheers of baseball fans far and wide. Historic artifacts will be on display and

commemorative baseballs honoring notable moments will adorn a comprehensive history wall.

The highlight of the immersive, hands-on Rawlings experience will be the glove vault, which will showcase Rawlings Gold Glove Awards and include an interactive custom glove center so you can design your very own custom glove.

Once you have your custom glove in hand, stop by Westport's brand-new



Soda Fountain Express for a sweet treat or 360 West for an inventive take on classic American cuisine.

In other news on the "newest" in STL, several area attractions are planning 2023 exhibits and rides, including fascinating shows at the Saint Louis Art Museum such as Monet/ Mitchell: Painting the French Landscape and The Culture: Hip Hop and Contemporary Art in the 21st Century.



History of the Area

1970s

The revitalization of The Loop began in the early 1970s. Nationally renowned restaurant and music club Blueberry Hill was the first of a new era of unique owneroperated businesses. Then came record stores, a bookstore and more.

The non-profit St. Louis Walk of Fame was founded and became a unifying attraction for the area. Now more than 150 stars and informative plaques are embedded in the sidewalks!

The elegant 1924 Tivoli Movie Theatre was beautifully restored and, along with many new gift shops and clothing boutiques, signaled The Loop had arrived.

During the last 50 years, the Delmar Loop has evolved into one of the most vibrant and entertaining areas in the US.

2000s Opening in 2,000 was The Pageant, a

2,000+ capacity concert venue that has featured artists such as Bob Dylan, Sting, Imagine Dragons, Janelle Monåe, Robert Plant, Dolly Parton, and Tiffany Haddish.

Many consider The Loop the live music center of St. Louis with 6 stages on which you can enjoy music of all genres.

Pin-Up Bowl's intimate 8-lane bowling attraction debuted, followed by the AAA 4-diamond Moonrise Hotel that features 125 rooms plus the largest man-made moon rotating above the indoor-outdoor rooftop Twilight Room with its great views of St. Louis.

Get your photo with the 8-ft, in-motion Chuck Berry Statue, dedicated to the Father of Rock & Roll.

United Provisions Grocery opened featuring items from around the globe. The 750-capacity Delmar Hall music venue debuted highlighting performers from St. Louis and other cities and countries.

Swade Marijuana Dispensary opened its doors and Magic Mini Golf (opening Spring 2023) will wow everyone with its 18 holes of indoor miniature golf, 2 indoor shuffleboard courts, and 5-cab indoor Ferris wheel. Party on!





Forest Park is also home to the Saint Louis Art Museum, the Saint Louis Science Center, the Missouri History Museum, The Muny and the Saint Louis Zoo.

Soak in the history of this wooded Victorian walking park. Tower Grove Park offers 150 years of historic treasures, including busts, buildings and entryways mixed with modern details, making the green space feel timeless. You can spend the afternoon playing pickleball, letting the kids enjoy the playground and splash pad and support local farmers and makers at the Tower Grove Farmers Market on Saturday mornings throughout the summer. And remember to bring your binoculars. This park is a birdwatcher's paradise.

At Creve Coeur Park outdoor activities abound. Choose from disc golf, archery, four playgrounds, a splash pad and Go Ape! Zip Line—a treetop adventure course with a 500-foot zip line. Or, take it easy and spend the day on the 320-acre Creve Coeur Lake and rent a kayak, canoe or paddleboard. You can also see the park from a new perspective and venture onto the Water Trail, a six-mile journey around the lake and along a creek with gorgeous views.

RACE ALONG THE MERAMEC



With a colorful history of early 1900s dance parties, Castlewood State Park is much quieter now. The music you'll hear today? The steady current of the Meramec River, wildlife and continuous birdsong. But visitors can still get their blood pumping on the park's extensive hiking and biking trails. Castlewood is one of the best mountain biking destinations in the area and offers sweeping views of the Meramec River from the Riverscene Trail, one of eight in this scenic park.

Shaw Nature Reserve offers 2,400 acres of richly diverse woodlands, wetlands, rolling prairies, ponds, native wildflowers and winding hiking trails with views along lush Meramec River frontage. An extention of the Missouri Botanical Garden, Shaw Nature Reserve is perfect



for casual hiking, nature photography, picnicking and meditating. It is also a site dedicated to education, research and habitat restoration.







LAUMEIER SCULPTURE PARK

n St. Louis, it's OK to pray for a rainy day. The Gateway to the West is an art lover's dream, with many of its museums offering free admission. Whether it's the work of Vincent Van Gogh or a contemporary visionary (who will one day be a household name), art in St. Louis is as accessible—and diverse—as art gets.

ART IN THE PARK

The Saint Louis Art Museum (SLAM) is home to a world-renowned collection of more than 34,000 cultural crown jewels spanning more than 5,000 years of human history. Come for the galleries filled with everything from mummies to new media and African art to Andy Warhol.

While you're there, factor in a little extra time for taking in the floor-to-ceiling views of Forest Park in the museum's east addition. With its vistas of Art Hill, SLAM's aptly named Panorama restaurant is a destination in itself, as is the museum's main building. Built for the 1904 World's Fair, it was designed by Cass Gilbert, the acclaimed architect behind the United States Supreme Court Building and several state capitols. Admission to this treasure is always free.

WHERE NEW NEVER GETS OLD

Admission to the Contemporary Art Museum (CAM) is also free. Its exhibits, however, are ever-changing. The lack of permanent collections is intentional. Their goal is to share the latest (and most thought-provoking) contemporary art depicting the world's current state of affairs—good and bad. The museum is located in the heart of St. Louis' Grand Center Arts District, home to myriad galleries and museums, including the Pulitzer Arts Foundation.







LIKE YOUR OWN PRIVATE COLLECTION

Housed in famed Japanese architect Tadao Ando's first free-standing building in the country, the prestigious Pulitzer Arts Foundation sits at the intersection of modernity and minimalism. Here, the Pulitzer family's world-renowned personal art collection—including classics and never-before-seen masterpieces—is bathed in natural light and shared with the public, at no charge. The Pulitzer Arts Foundation offers a unique, intimate viewing experience. Since the museum doesn't post nameplates or text descriptions, visitors are invited to interpret the art as they wish.

ZOOM IN, IN GOOD COMPANY

Less than a half mile away, the International Photography Hall of Fame welcomes visitors to take a deep dive into the art and science of photography. Its permanent Hall of Fame exhibit pays homage to icons including Ansel Adams, Annie Leibovitz and the inventor of the iPhone, Steve Jobs. The museum's collection of vintage camera equipment—including an extremely rare Edison Kinetoscope—shows the evolution of capturing, and ultimately sharing, special moments in time. Admission is \$10 (or free of charge on the first Friday of the month

during Grand Center's ongoing First Fridays events).

NO DOG LEFT BEHIND

While St. Louis residents welcome rainy days, sunny days are reserved for walking the art-filled trails at Laumeier Sculpture Park. One of the first dedicated

sculpture parks in the country, Laumeier is home to 68 larger-than-life sculptures nestled

harmoniously in nature. Admission is always free, and as long as they're leashed, pets are invited to enjoy this Insta-worthy outdoor gallery, too. When it comes to art, the Gateway to the West does not discriminate. Rain or shine, there's truly something for everyone—even our four-legged friends.

he space capsules for the Mercury and Gemini missions were crafted in St. Louis, and that passion for science and technology extends to the family fun that can be had here. Watch brains (and faces) light up as your family discovers our popular STEAMcentric and kid-approved St. Louis attractions. Whether braving the watery depths, building a robot or exploring alien landscapes, your young scientists will get hands-on exposure to out-of-this-world concepts.

So, strap in and hold on tight...your family adventure is ready for lift-off.

POWERING UP PLAYTIME

Playtime is serious business for kids. Creative play is one of the best ways to ramp up healthy brain development and transform new experiences into strong neural pathways that would make Einstein proud. No one knows this better than The Magic House, St. Louis' award-winning children's museum. Kiddos (up to age 12) can play their way through hundreds of interactive exhibits designed to boost curiosity, collaboration, and critical thinking, all in the name of fun. You might climb a magic beanstalk, take a trip to Alaska with Molly of Denali (of PBS Kids fame) or head to the Bubble Room for floaty fun.

For more hands-on adventures, check out MADE for Kids, a 7,000-square-foot makerspace where kids (ages 4-14) can invent, build and design to their hearts' content. Try LEGO robotics, launch a rocket, design and output objects on a 3D printer or sit down at the pottery wheel to create a takehome masterpiece.

INITIATING EXPLORER MODE

At the "scientifically fun" Myseum, (ages 2-12), minds and bodies are kept busy with more than 30 exhibits to explore. This indoor play-center-meetschildren's-science-museum features everything from laser harps to dino digs. Whether your kiddos prefer the zoo vet clinic or the Imagination Playground, their fun doubles as an introduction to scientific principles that still propel research everyday.

Connect with curiosity at the Saint Louis Science Center, located in Forest Park. With more than 700 exhibits, it's not only one of the country's largest science museums, it also offers free admission. Visitors can measure up to a life-size T-Rex, execute an out-of-this-world mission to Mars, immerse themselves in virtual reality or build their very own Gateway Arch. Ready for more eyeopening moments? Round out your visit by purchasing a ticket to the

McDonnell Planetarium or the fivestory-tall OMNIMAX® Theater for a larger-than-life on-screen scientific adventure.

Kids get to become astronauts, scientists and engineers at the Challenger Learning Center. Through space simulation programs and Discovery workshops, they will visit out-of-this-world places like Mars and the Moon, while also learning about Ground Control, rockets and more.

SEARCHING FOR SIGNS OF LIFE


Science is wild, and if you need further proof, look to the Saint Louis Zoo. Another Forest Park gem (that also offers free admission), this innovative zoo and research institution is a biologist's dream. It's home to more than 14,000 animals and nearly 500 species, plus a globally renowned wildlife conservation program. While you take a walk on the wild side, your family will learn about humanity's impact on the world's delicate habitats and how you and yours can help protect them.


Want more animal action? Take a deep dive into marine biology by visiting the St. Louis Aquarium at Union Station. Eat Like a Local

Great eats and sweet treats that locals love.

Legend has it that St. Louis' iconic dessert, the gooey butter cake, was concocted when an absentminded baker forgot that he'd already added butter to his yellow cake mix and unknowingly doubled the amount. Ask any St. Louisan about the birth of the city's signature dessert, and you'll get the same story. After all, we don't just enjoy our food; we take our rich food culture seriously.

When you dive into the dishes that define eating in the Gateway City, you'll understand why St. Louisans are a proud bunch. The pork steak, for instance, is the definition of St. Louis barbecue. A slice of meat off the Boston butt is cooked in a tangy, tomatoey and often beerinfused barbecue sauce. If summer in

St. Louis had a flavor, this would be it, though it's hard to dispute the role Ted Drewes Frozen Custard plays in providing an essential summertime experience. Creamy, thick and enjoyed while on the custard stand's asphalt parking lot, a visit to The Lou is not complete without a trip to this south St. Louis landmark located on historic Route 66.

Equally emblematic of St. Louis' food identity is toasted ravioli, or "t-ravs," as the locals call them. If these deep-fried, ground beef-stuffed pillows of pasta are the city's quintessential bar food, then the Slinger is its midnight snack. This diner masterpiece consists of a hamburger patty topped with eggs, hash browns, cheese and chili—not for the faint of heart, but would you expect anything less from a place that defines its pizza style by processed cheese?

Those on
the outside may
side-eye our beloved
Provel, but once you experience this luxurious wonder atop a
slice of St. Louis-style pie, you'll become a
believer. Really, there's no better topping
for our thin-crust, square-cut pizza. The
gooey cheese melds into the dough, so
you don't know where one ends and the
other begins. Pros know that this presents a hazard: Eat the pizza too soon out
of the oven and you're likely to burn the
roof of your mouth with molten cheese.
It's a culinary experience totally worth

We Take Great Pride

Follow the rainbow to St. Louis.

The Gateway to the West has been described as "the openminded heart of the Midwest" by The Advocate, America's oldest-running LGBTQ+ publication and one which continues to rate The Lou high in its annual rankings of gay-friendly cities. In addition, author Gregory Kompes named St. Louis one of the top 10 lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender-friendly cities in his book, 50 Fabulous Gay-Friendly Places to Live. Why? For its "liveand-let-live attitude, extensive cultural attractions and flourishing nightlife."

So, fly your Pride flags freely in St. Louis! Belly up to the bar in some of the city's renowned hotspots; visit the unique array of shops, restaurants and coffeehouses in gay-friendly neighborhoods such as The Grove or the Central West End; and peruse pronoun pins amid the huge assortment of rainbow Pride merch at CheapTrx. a two-story mecca that's been a staple of the South Grand neighborhood since 1992. While you're in St. Louis, catch a performance by the Gateway Men's Chorus and pay your respects at the Transgender Memorial Garden in the Benton Park neighborhood.

Wonderful LGBTQ+ venues offer a variety of experiences, from sleek, expansive spots with performance stages and outdoor seating to piano bars where martinis never run dry to local, low-key drag wonderlands and even casual nightclubs serving the LGBTQ+ crowd and its allies.

And then, there's the parade. Now in its 43rd year, St. Louis plays host to one of the Midwest's largest PrideFest celebrations, with attendance topping 300,000 annually. The two-day event features local and national entertainment acts across multiple stages at the downtown Soldier's Memorial every June. Revelers enjoy vendors, food trucks, a dance tent and, of course, the parade, which has the Gateway Arch as its iconic backdrop.

Additional festivals and parades are hosted by Black Pride St. Louis, the nation's second-oldest Black LGBTQ+ Pride organization in the country, the Alton Pride Festival, Tower Grove Pride and the Metro East Pride Fest.





History buffs will meet their match in the Gateway to the West.

From the founding of St. Louis on the banks of the Mississippi River in 1764, to the launch of Lewis and Clark's Corps of Discovery Expedition on the Missouri in 1804, to Dred Scott's 1857 trial at the Old Courthouse downtown—St. Louis is steeped in centuries of history.

Noted as "first in shoes, first in booze," the city has served as an incubator for the blues, a launchpad for Charles Lindbergh's Spirit of St. Louis, manufacturer of Project Mercury and Gemini NASA spacecraft and home of the midcentury marvel that is the Gateway Arch. But before there was St. Louis, there was Cahokia. One of the world's greatest ancient cities and abandoned in the 14th

century, Cahokia was larger than London in AD 1250. You can explore the City of the Sun—Cahokia Mounds—just across the river from downtown St. Louis.

Landmarks, trails, museums, historic homes, churches, cemeteries, cobblestone streets and spots on the National Register of Historic Places dot the landscape of this bustling river metropolis. Cross the **Eads Bridge**, the world's first









steel-truss bridge, located in the shadow of the Arch. Explore St. Louis' African-American heritage at the Griot Museum of Black History or the city's role in worldwide events at the Soldiers Memorial Military Museum.

Car and train lover? Check out St. Louis' longstanding love affair with locomotion at the National Museum of Transportation. Visit White Haven, the more than 200-year-old home of Ulysses S. Grant, our 18th president and the Civil War general who led the Union to victory. Marvel at the elaborate mausoleums at Bellefontaine Cemetery, where the St. Louis elite have been buried for more than 170 years. And music lovers will want to stop by the Scott Joplin House, home of the famous ragtime composer, from 1901 to 1903. It's now a state historic site.

The Saint Louis Art Museum, Missouri History Museum and The Muny, the country's oldest and largest outdoor musical theatre, are all located in Forest Park, one of the largest urban parks in the U.S. Officially opened in 1876, the 1,300 acres of this beautifully landscaped park welcome more than 12 million visitors annually and played host to the 1904 World's Fair.

There's much more "did you know?" to explore in this historic city. Take the time to immerse yourself and experience the extraordinary up-close.





St. Louis Nightlife

We have a history of taking nightlife seriously.

Drink lore holds that the first-ever cocktail party happened in St. Louis. It's fitting that the city has such a robust nightlife scene, stretching from the city proper to the far corners of the metro area. For a nightclub vibe, downtown's Washington Avenue boasts sleek, metropolitan lounges, while the Central West End is St. Louis drinking culture's cosmopolitan center, with stylish, speakeasy-style bars that serve some of the city's best cocktails.

South St. Louis is the heart of the area's classic dive-bar scene, though you will also find trendy spots, and even an enclave operated by a woman inducted into the Gin Hall of Fame. If it's a French

Quarter sort of vibe you're looking for, don't miss **Soulard**, the city's walkable, historically French neighborhood, filled with a host of music-oriented watering holes.

The Grove, the heart of St. Louis LGBTQ+ nightlife culture, is the city's hippest neighborhood with vinyl lounges, arcade bars, live music clubs and even an adult slushie shop. It's considered by many to be the area's top going-out destination, though recently, Ballpark Village, located just outside Busch Stadium, a.k.a. Cardinal Nation, has given it a run for its money. This multifaceted entertainment complex, featuring rooftop lounges, sports bars and outdoor imbibing areas is the place to see and be seen downtown.

And the area's bustling bar scene is not limited to the city proper. Maplewood boasts a lively strip that includes everything from craft breweries and cocktail bars to a metalhead bar that serves the neighborhood's must-eat brunch. Clayton, the bi-state region's tony burb, is filled with upscale restaurants and bars, including a top-notch hotel lounge, while Webster Groves offers a warm welcome with cozy spots to settle in for the evening. Finally, those seeking variety should head to Westport Plaza's entertainment district, which offers pours from sake to suds to cocktailsshaken or stirred.




he beverage scene in St. Louis rests on a solid foundation of one world-ranked brewer, nearly 65 craft breweries, countless distilleries and wineries, bustling bars and some very talented mixologists. What's not to like? Or, better yet, what's not to order? Options to imbibe in St. Louis are limitless. From local beer, cider and wine to delectable cocktails and even boozy ice creams this city can satisfy any thirst.

MIDWEST BREWING INNOVATION

Let's start with St. Louis' fixation on beer. More than 165 years ago, German brewers found the naturally cool caves under St. Louis ideal for fermenting their lagers. And the nearby proximity of the Mississippi River provided one of their recipes' key ingredients—water. Today, Anheuser-Busch, maker of world-famous Budweiser, serves as a hub for brewing innovation, producing more than 30 brands of beer.

Nestled throughout St. Louis, dozens of craft breweries follow suit. **Urban Chestnut** has two locations. The midtown spot feels like a European


biergarten while the brewery in The Grove is a European-style bierhall. Formerly a paper company built in the 1920s, UCBC's Grove location offers beers on tap that are updated weekly. American and Bavarian-style lagers, Russian imperial stouts, pilsners, pale ales and Munich Dunkels are served at large, communal picnic-style tables under strands of twinkling lights. With names like Zwickel, Schnickelfritz and Stammtisch, you'll definitely want to order some pretzel sticks and twice-fried pommes frites with Bavarian mustard to pair with your suds.



LET THE SPIRIT MOVE YOU

Just a "pint away from the ballpark," 4 Hands Brewery pours a wide range of beers, including seasonal and limited releases. The beers are great, but this fan-favorite brewery also produces two lines of local spirits: 1220 Spirits, botanically-inspired spirits and liqueurs, and Withered Oak, its family of whiskies. The two-story tasting room includes food, free classic arcade games and Skee-Ball. If the spirit moves you, as they say, check out Still 630. This award-winning craft distillery just south of downtown, offers tours, tastings and bottle sales of its "Indomitable Spirits."

If cider is your thing, head to Brick River Cider Co., housed in former Engine House Number 32. Just a few blocks north of Union Station, Brick River's ciders are made from fresh-pressed Midwestern fruit. The building, constructed in 1892 as the largest fire station west of the Mississippi River, is now a laid-back tap room and gastro pub with garage-style doors that open on nice days. Semi-sweet and dry ciders impart hints of apple and peach-as close to the orchard as it gets.

SHAKE IT UP

If it's a cocktail you seek, shake things up with mixologists at the Central West End's Brass Bar, Webster Groves' Olive + Oak, Vicia in the Cortex and Pop Sparkling Bar in Lafayette Square. With names like Half Chuffed and Rest Energy (Brass Bar); an assortment of seasonal sippers such as the #122, with gin, amaro, pomegranate, lime and Jamaican spice (Olive + Oak) and a selection of European bubblies (Pop), your tastebuds will be in hyperdrive.

But that's just the tip of the iceberg in terms of unique drink menus. Other must-stops include iTap for an incredible beer selection; Acero, with its Italian wine list; Mission Taco for margaritas; Salt + Smoke for all things bourbon; Art Bar for rooftop cocktails in Grand Center; Small Batch for whiskey and Sidney Street Café for sophisticated sips in a wood-paneled bar.

To satisfy that sweet tooth, you'll want to swing by Bella's Sweet Treats & Boozy Shake Shop, Clementine's Creamery and The Fountain on Locust, where bourbon, Champagne and other "naughty and nice" flavors round out the offerings.








Celebrate by the light of the moon at **The Muny** in **Forest Park**. Aging graciously at 106, and with 11,000 seats, it's the oldest and largest outdoor theatre in the country. OTSL has presented 31 world premieres and 27 American premieres, including one, Fire Shut Up in My Bones, that played at The Met after making its St. Louis debut. With performances held during a six-week period, the festival atmosphere includes preopera picnics in the gardens and drinks under the stars after the show. A first


in the country, there are 50 free seats available at every OTSL performance; tickets are available on a first-come, firstserved basis.

St. Louis is full of performance venues featuring a range of incredible artists across a spectrum of genres, including The Fabulous Fox, The Sheldon Concert Hall, The Factory, The Grandel, The Pageant and Broadway Oyster Bar.

So, without further ado, on with the show.






